Over the last two years, my co-conspirator, Ruth Livesey and I have lovingly adapted George Eliot's 19th century epic novel, Middlemarch for Coventry 2022. Determined to create an experience where the audience can feel part of the community of Middlemarch, we decided to situate the drama across four locations in Central Coventry where our audience, our Middlepeople (community performers) and professional cast can gather: Mrs Dollop's Green Dragon Pub, Mrs Vincy's Living Room, Bulstrode's Bank and the Town Hall.

We have run workshops with actors and members of the community, from and around Coventry, to understand how we might inhabit this beautiful book and create a theatrical production with it. And most importantly, we chose to place our drama in 1982, forty years ago, mirroring George Eliot's Middlemarch, which she wrote in 1871-2, forty years on from the world she depicted in her Middlemarch, a town inspired by Coventry where she'd been to school. Whilst keeping much of her astonishing original writing, we have sought to bring the magic, challenges and music of life in Coventry in the 80s to our show, and hope that you enjoy a step through time with us.
